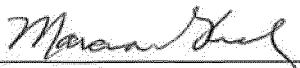
1. The work session was called to order by Mayor Pro Tem Kline at 6:17 p.m.
2. Councilmembers Present: Kline, Webb, Selman, Backen, Mayor Blonigan
Staff Present: Marcia Glick, City Manager

Review Current Dimensional Details of Proposed LRT Layout between 39th and 47th

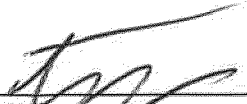
3. In addition to the City Council there were several members of the public who were reviewing the map showing the impacts outside of the current curb lines and elimination of one of the left turn lanes from north bound CR 81 to west bound CR 9.
4. As council was getting ready for the next meeting at the council dais, Glick shared quick points from the project office
 - The project office has compiled numbers for each intersection in Robbinsdale and timing impacts in both no-build and build with center running LRT (not including traffic impacts from a park and ride or expected new redevelopment.) This data will be used to create a side-by-side video so that people will be able to look at the data table as well as a video form. The project office is also working on getting information on pre-emption call data from when emergency vehicles change the normal traffic light pattern.
 - Currently the maximum speed LRT can travel at intersections is 35 mph, they are working on getting this updated to 40 mph. The speed would be slower between 40th and 42nd related to slow down/speed up from a station platform.
 - Tracks would be embedded at pedestrian and traffic crossings.
 - They are planning a corridor wide mailing near the issuance of the mid-December draft release; in Robbinsdale this will include the entire city. There will be a 45 day public comment period after the draft release. They are also looking at providing an on-line survey working with the City Council on the questions.
5. Glick reported on the update on outreach efforts by the project team. The team has made direct contact with North Memorial and Robin Center vs contracted outreach. Commissioner Lunde has personally held driveway meetings with face-to-face with more residents in Robbinsdale than other locations. Staff is also working to get survey data and contracted outreach efforts in Robbinsdale.
6. Backen noted that although flyers were to have been dropped off in 4th Ward, he did not personally receive a flyer.
7. Glick polled the council for dates for a comprehensive update for city council members by the project team between December 6 and 21. Monday December 6 and 13 were identified as potential options for a meeting.
